KS2 Best Bits this week

Year 3 have had a brilliant first week back and have settled in really well. They've explored how different artists use charcoal to tell a story through their drawings. They then created their own (very messy!) charcoal drawings based on their history theme 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. They've been very active in PE lessons with a focus on team building activities too.



What a great first week back Year 4 have had after the summer break – as part of their Romans theme, they created mosaic patterns to decorate the entrance to their classroom. It was a bit fiddly, but turned out great. They also had a day of music, making mosaic motifs and combining them, reversing the pitch and performing together. They had a check on how rusty their handwriting was following the break, but all was good, and finally they began looking at the three states of matter: solids, liquids and gases.

Year 5 have had a wonderfully creative week! They explored typography and designed their own imaginative Cyclops' Islands, showing fantastic creativity. In English, they've been practising their handwriting, focusing carefully on the anti-clockwise letters and they've also been working hard on their spellings through Emile. Well done to everyone for their enthusiasm and effort!



In Year 6 they've quickly adapted to new routines and have completed some excellent learning. Staff are incredibly impressed with all learning completed with the class especially enjoying a range of practical tasks and games to revisit their knowledge of place value – a particular favourite was Four in a Row! Well done, Year 6! What a great start to the year!

This academic year, we are using 'Picture News' as a resource to support us in finding the positives in current affairs by turning world events into learning opportunities.

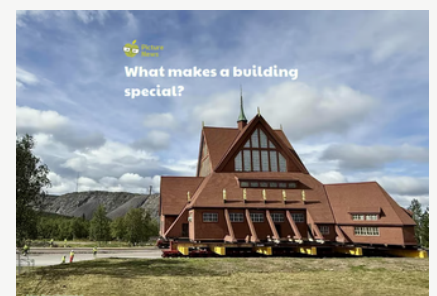
We know that children see stories in the news they are curious or confused about and this can sometimes be tricky to explain. Picture News will help us show your children the world around them in a child-friendly way.
